Rehabilitation of a blighted property to create supportive housing for homeless families

North 17 Apartments

Arizona Housing Inc. (AHI) purchased the foreclosed and partially vacant apartment building in mid-2011. At the time, it was a blighted property and a source of crime for Phoenix's Sunnyslope neighborhood. AHI partnered with the Foundation for Senior Living to manage the complete rehabilitation of the property.

North 17 Apartments re-opened its doors in May 2012, providing 72 renovated units (including 36 one-bedroom units and 36 two-bedroom units) for very low-income, homeless families. Eighteen of the units are targeted to households who are chronically homeless. These units use project-based Housing Choice vouchers to ensure that the rents are affordable to its target population of long-term homeless families.

Tenant Profile:

Very low-income, homeless families; 18 families are chronically homeless

Service Approach:

Arizona Housing, Inc. is partnering with Community Bridges to help tenants access community resources, and to provide onsite support such as employment services, life skills classes, behavioral health/addiction services, AA meetings, and peer support. Services are voluntary and tenants are not required to participate as a condition of tenancy.

Key Features and Innovations:

- The fully renovated units include energy efficient windows, doors, appliances, air conditioning and heating systems, and low-flow faucets and toilets to reduce overall operating costs.
- Onsite community amenities include laundry facilities, employment center, community kitchen, library with computer lab, two large community rooms, and playground.
- An onsite afterschool program serves the children at North 17 Apartments as well as children from a nearby family shelter – Vista Colina Emergency Family Shelter.
- AHI will oversee onsite social activities, such as a resident council, block watch group, and weekday "farmers market." These activities are designed to strenghten community connections onsite.
