#### **100K Homes Campaign**

As one of the over 180 communities involved in the campaign, we are not interested in who gets credit or who gets blame.

We are interested in who gets housed.

Together, we are leading a national movement to permanently house 100,000 of our most vulnerable and chronically homeless neighbors.

In the process, we are transforming the way our communities respond to homelessness and ensuring that a lifetime on the streets will be unheard of and unimaginable to our children.



### **VULNERABILITY STUDY**

Dr. Jim O'Connell from the Boston Health Clinic studied a cohort to determine factors that lead to a greater risk of morbidity on the streets.





# 100,000 HOMES CAMPAIGN

#### **Vulnerability Factors:**

- 1. Liver Disease
- 2. End-Stage Renal Disease
- 3. HIV+/AIDS
- 4. Age over 60 years
- 5. History of Cold Weather Injury
- 6. 3 or more ER visits in the previous 3 months
- 7. 3 or more ER and/or Inpatient episodes in the past year
- 8. Tri-morbidity



### 100,000 HOMES CAMPAIGN

# The leadership team added the following vulnerability points for our Indy Campaign:

- 9. Under 24 years-old
- 10. Pregnant
- 11. Parenting children under the age of 18
- 12. Mental illness



### 100,000 HOMES CAMPAIGN



#### INTERVIEW METHODOLOGY

- Team leader with three team members
- Divided area into sectors
- Cover assigned sector on 3 consecutive mornings
  - Some teams had changes to coverage based on happenings the day before
- Ask each person encountered to participate
- Log refusals
- Offer full day bus pass as a thank you for participating
- Offer blankets and socks to anyone found
