All of the support I have received from 28th Street Apartments has showed me that I do have a purpose in life and to never give up.

December 31, 2012 was the best day of my life. I had the privilege to move into the 28th street apartments which is partnered with Coalition for Responsible Community Development and Clifford Beers housing. Since moving into my new home I have completed Marinello School of Beauty in with a certificate of completion in cosmetology.

I get my son every weekend and holidays. I am still receiving weekly therapy sessions. As of April 2014 I have completed my 3 years of probation.

If anyone was to ask if I regret anything, I would simple say. "There is nothing I regret. It was all just a lesson. Being homeless was my downfall to rise to the top."
