I am safe and secure, happy to be alive.

During the 2011 homeless census I was found sleeping on a sofa outside Goodwill in the donations area. I was now considered chronically homeless and most likely to die on the streets within a year. Because of people reaching out to me I was saved from myself. I was taught through being loved to love myself.

I have a wonderful home today for my dog and I. I am safe and secure, happy to be alive. I am 17 months clean and sober, huge considering I spent 40 years in my addiction that I never believed I could get out from under.

Today I am just like those of you who helped save me. We are in the business of bringing the unseen back into view, offering up a second chance to the hopeless and placing value back into the souls of those who like myself were once lost.
