Eric Garcetti talking homelessness tomorrow at national conference

LOS ANGELES — Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti is set to be a panelist in a discussion on homelessness and housing at the three-day CSH Supportive Housing Summit, which begins today at the Westin Bonaventure Hotel. CSH stands for Corporation for Supportive Housing, a national nonprofit working to ensure housing and support services are developed locally to take people out of homelessness.

The panel titled "Leveraging Local Political Will to Create Supportive Housing" will examine how Mayor Garcetti and others worked with community leaders to champion Proposition

HHH, a ballot measure approved in 2016 by Los Angeles City voters allocating over \$1 billion to pay for new housing for homeless people and also to fund facilities that provide mental health care, addiction treatment and other services to end homelessness.

The Mayor will provide an update on his Administration's efforts to build more affordable housing throughout Los Angeles.

The panel discussion will be moderated by CSH President and CEO Deborah De Santis.

More than 1100 people from 39 states are set to attend the Summit and panel presentation.

Other panelists at the meeting include Los Angeles County Supervisor Mark Ridley-Thomas and United Way of Greater Los Angeles President and CEO Elise Buik.
