Purpose	The purpose of awards is to assist local, state, and tribal governments in converting reentry and permanent supportive housing service contracts into outcomes-based contracts in order to ensure accountability and improve performance with regard to recidivism reduction (categories 1 and 2), and increasing nights housed and demonstrating emergency service savings (Category 2).
	<ul> <li>Award Dollars Cover:         <ul> <li>Assistance/funding to state, local, and tribal governments for them to price, write, negotiate, fund, and manage contracts that pay for services in a way that ensures accountability of the contract service providers, and incentivizes improved performance over time.</li> <li>Contracted services that may be purchased with grant funds include reentry services tailored to individuals leaving incarceration who are at moderate to high risk for recidivism in the community as well as services available to individuals living in permanent supportive housing units.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
