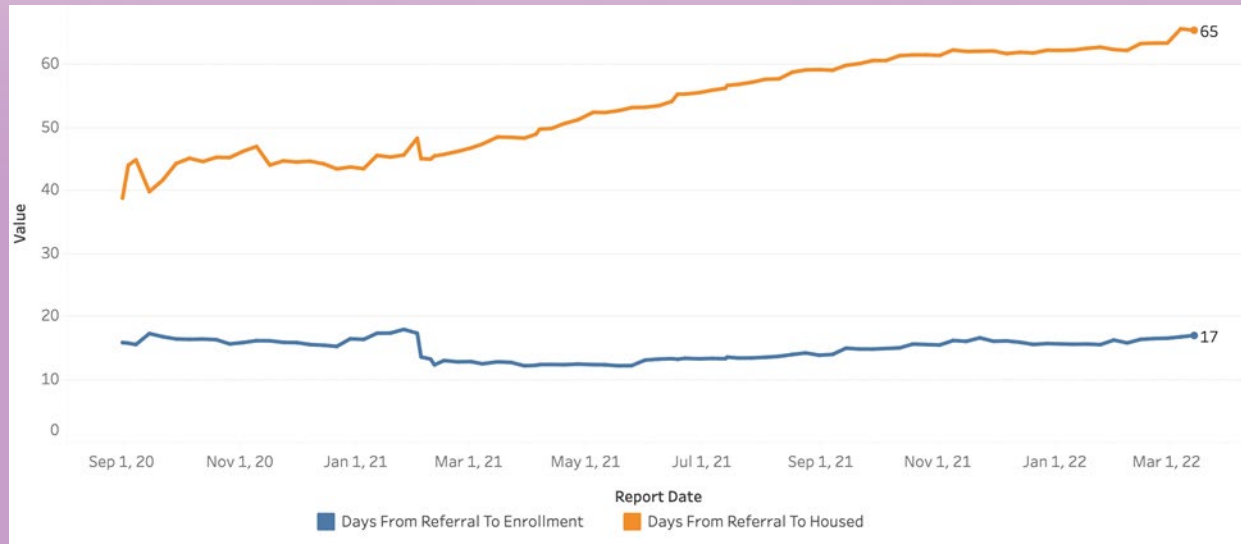

CES Pathway to Housing allocated for DV/HT Survivors – Update

- **Recent Enhancement to Assessment Process** – the survivors now have the option to complete the Housing History Tool within the Assessment with their Case Manager vs the Assessor. This was implemented in Feb 2022 per input from service providers.
- **Prioritization Expansion**
 - Given housing inventory and relatively lighter waitlist, a discussion on expanding prioritization was initiated at the DV Workgroup Meeting in March – start as test to include direct referrals from DV Agencies currently referring from the shelters. It was determined that before expanding Prioritization (even as a test), we would do the following:
 - We will test the Assessment Process enhancement for 3 months and adjust to ensure it is working as expected.
 - DV Workgroup will determine and implement additional system enhancements, if any, that must be implemented before expanding Prioritization.
 - DV Prioritization Team (from within the Workgroup) will also be initiating discussions on including vulnerability factors in addition to length of homelessness while prioritizing on the waitlist

CES Pathway to Housing allocated for DV/HT Survivors – Update

- **Training** – Quarterly training on CES Process, DV101 and HT101 for service providers, housing providers, navigators, assessors is being scheduled.
- **Input form PLE** on System Enhancements - Service Providers are in the process of identifying a few DV survivors who can participate in the Workgroup meetings to inform system enhancements.
- **Upcoming CES DV related meetings:**
 - March 25th - DV Prioritization Team meets to discuss vulnerability factors that should be included in prioritization
 - March 30th – All Chicago, CSH and The Network are meeting to understand any outstanding pain points with the system and determining next steps towards solutions
