Kirk, Speak Up! Advocate: Hello, my name is Kirk Allen. I'm currently residing in New Direction. My story is, I was a commercial truck driver. I drove over 48 states - driving 10 hours a day, 3500 miles a week. Over time, I got injured. Once I got injured, I went to the doctor. Kirk: I became an owner-operator. During that time, my injury got worse. Being an owner-operator, you have to - pretty much, you know - pay for everything. Your maintenance and everything. I didn't have medical insurance, so i ended up at the VA hospital they did the surgery for me. Once I was done with the surgery, I became an outpatient. Being an outpatient, they want you to, you know, move on. They have other people waiting for the beds.	Kirk speaks to the camera in the courtyard of a building.
Kirk: So my only option was Skid Row. Now, being a vet and in that state of mind, and in a wheelchair - I was really you know stressed. Like, there's no way I was going to Skid Row in a wheelchair - that's my point. They had no other options, so eventually they got me another case worker. Kirk: The caseworker, you know, looked for me and they found me housing - transitional housing - for disabled vets in Bell California. Once I stayed in Bell California, I ended up in New Directions which I'm very happy with. You know they really helped me. I have a brand new place. I'm trying to recover right now. I am recovering. But I like to thank CSH because I'm an advocate for them. I'm a voice for them. And I want to help anybody I can help. And thankful for CSH and, my life is good.
